Current Political situation and how it affects entry to the UK:

After China's imposition of a national security law on Hong Kong, the UK confirmed that new arrangements will be put in place for British Nationals (Overseas) ("BN(O)"s).

New immigration rules will allow BN(O) citizens the right to live and work in the UK for longer and give a path to full British Citizenship. This new immigration route will allow BN(O)s to come to the UK without the current 6 month limit, granting them 5 years limited leave to remain, with the ability to live and work in the UK. After 5 years, they will be able to apply for settled status, and after a further 12 months with that status, apply for citizenship.

Whilst this new route is for BN(O)s, other routes remain available to Hong Kong nationals considering a move to the UK.
